2. UPDATE ON TURNITIN AI DETECTION TOOL - ACADEMIC QUALITY OFFICE.

- ➤ Rebecca White (Senior Academic Quality Analyst) provided an update regarding the recently trialled Turnitin AI Detection Tool.
 - Rebecca requested for technical questions to be sent to the project manager.
 - The tool is used to check for generative AI within class work.
 - UoA is not using for now:
 - Turnitinit did not provide enough information on how it arrived at the outcomes.
 - UoA wanted to give staff communications on how to use the tool and wanted to give them time to understand how it worked.
 - Current Status:
 - Turnitin has reduced the rate of false positives to less than 1%.
 - UoA has not detected any false positives but other institutions have.
 - Recommendation to come to` the teaching and learning qualities committee on the use of this will occur in October 2023.
- > Through consultation a recommendation has been made to focus on assessment redesign rather than using AI detection tool.
- ➤ UoA does not have a policy regarding AI in coursework but does have guidelines:
 - As of current it is upto the course director if AI is to be used.
 - There has been some instances of course directors not disclosing and listing apps people can use.
 - Causes confusion and students have had academic issues regarding this.
 - Students are able to appeal misconduct if a course director has not made it clear what tools cannot be used.
 - Point made that students are not aware that they can appeal decisions.
 - Questions on how the assessment redesign approach would work?
 - Potentially use a ChatGPT output and to critique this answer.
 - Questions regarding how to communicate this to international students who are new to the English language system.
 - They may not understand the rules and guidelines and accidentally undertake academic misconduct.

- A recommendation is made to offer academic integrity guidelines in other languages.
- Rebbeca asked if there are any other reasons that turnitin should not use AI detection.
 - An issue is raised where what "Lecturers says, goes".
 - Sometimes we don't even know if the students carried misconduct and cases are referred to the Disciplinary Committee.
 - Noted to reach DC, repeat offences must occur or must be a major offence.

 - UoA is doing a great job relative to other university.


■ Debt free future by 2040:

 - Working financial strategy.
 - Vinyl Sale.
 - Looking for students to get more involved:
 - Public speaking,
 - Graphic design
 - Audio engineering,
 - Hosting a show.
 - Etc
 - Have had 88 student volunteers register their interest.
 - o 14k of income from record sales.
 - 10k incoming from alumni.
 - Looking for a cash injection from NZ on Air.
 - 95b fm is the cheapest to fund per listener.
 - Possible ways to increase engagement:
 - Used an AGM at Otago to let students do podcasts on air.
 - Did 8 flagship podcasts a semester and used it as a platform to promote them.
 - Possibly start a mental health show with anonymous requests.
