2. CFT UPDATE

- Presented by Peter Shand.
- Peter Shand to send through documentation regarding the 90point (or greater) research component.
- Student engagement will be involved in the pilot transdisciplinary courses. An ideation session with the Student Consultative Group will take place in the April meeting.
- Future of Food, AI, Migration Pathways, and Indigenous Learnings are the four TD new courses from next year.
- There will be a negative EFTS impact for some faculties due to the phasing out of Gen Ed. This will mean a drop in enrolments for some of their courses.
- Transitions regulations These are continuing to be worked on with a clear set of parameters and rules.
 - Science students are most impacted. A significant shift in the sizes of majors.
- Associate Deans Academic Community of Practice. Which faculties are connecting with students?
 - The Student Council indicated that their Faculties have yet to reach out.
 - Peter Shand to follow up with faculties regarding this.

3. USE OF GENERATIVE AI ANNOUNCEMENT

- Nissa Anderson (Product Owner), on behalf of Gemma Sinclair presented this item.
- Generative AI statement on Canvas.
 - The statement was generally perceived to be ok by the Student Council. It was good and it had to be read unless you manually went and hit the "X" to close it.
- Concerns were raised about the use of Grammarly and this potentially being picked up as plagiarism. This is to be passed to the Academic Quality Office.
- Who do students contact to confirm if they can/cannot use AI?
- Guidance is needed on what if your lecturer does not clarify whether you can use it or not. Some lecturers stay silent and the students are unsure.

4. FEEDBACK ON DIGITAL SIGNAGE

Discussion on Building Displays with classes for that day.

- 20 seconds was decided to be the optimal display time. The current 2 minutes display time is too long.
- Course names on displays to be shortened to read easier.
